## Malachi 3:6-18 The Value of God

### \*Our value of God is identified by our lifestyle

=>Nothing reveals more about us than money

#### I. The call to Return to God

- A. People were separated from God
  - 1. God was not being honored (1:6-8)
  - 2. God was not being feared (3:5)
- B. God calls people to return
  - 1. Repeated actions
  - 2. Return refers to a relationship
- C. God does not change (Praise!)

## II. The Conditions of returning to God

- A. Requirement: "Full" tithe
  - 1. Only brought partial and inconsistent
  - 2. Brought without the idea of worship
- B. Tithing is a command
  - 1. Leviticus 27:30 = bring a 10th of the crops, etc.
  - 2. Numbers 18:21-32 = Tithes given to Levites who share with the priests
  - 3. Deuteronomy 12:5-18: 14:22-29 = Share with others as an act of worship

#### C. God's promise

- 1. There were cursed
- 2. There will be food in the storehouse
- 3. Test me
- 4. God protects and provides
  - =>2 Reasons we don't tithe
    - a. We don't trust God will provide (enough)
    - b. We don't think about God often enough

### III. The Conviction of Following God

- A. Lost values
  - 1. Words against God
  - 2. What value is in following God?
  - 3. Evildoers prosper and evade God and His judgment
- B. Those who fear God
  - 1. Made a commitment
  - 2. The LORD claimed them
  - 3. They became distinct (instead of extinct)
- C. Standards are kept by values
  - 1. Morals reflect values
  - 2. Decisions reveal values
- D. Eternal Destiny
  - i. Dangerous
  - ii. Deeds of ungodliness
  - iii. Judgment is already reserved

#### IV. Live it Out

- A. Are you concerned about how God will react to your life decisions?
- B. Are you saying, "No" to God's standard or the world's?
- C. What is your practice of tithing?
  - 1. When do you give? (consistently)
  - 2. How much? (Your amount or God's)
    - =>Trusting God can be scary at first like a high ropes course.
